OPEN SPACE AUTHORITY TAKES STEP TOWARD OPEN SPACE PRESERVATION IN SANTA TERESA FOOTHILLS

Good News! After years of lobbying by the Santa Teresa Foothills Neighborhood Association, the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara County Open Space Authority recently voted to authorize their staff to begin negotiations with the owner of the Sanchez property for possible purchase.

Purchase of this property, which is located at the western end of the foothills near Miracle Mountain Drive, would be significant in terms of the long-term goal of preserving the natural landscape. It would be the first parcel acquired by the Open Space Authority in the Santa Teresa area, which would hopefully lead to additional purchases as other properties become available.

In addition, the staff of the Open Space Authority is undertaking a comprehensive review of the Santa Teresa Foothills to identify those areas where the threat of future development is highest.



CAUCUS FOR NEIGHBORHOODS COMMISSIONERS

The San Jose City Council approved creation of a two year Neighborhoods Commission pilot in Fall 2007. Since that time, work has been in process to prepare for Commissioner selection. Each City Council district will be able to recommend 3 commissioners and 2 alternates. The recommendations will be submitted to the City Council.

Showcasel

An ad-hoc committee has been assisting with the process for formation of the commission. District 2 resident Lynne Paulson and District 10 resident Art Boudreault have been participating along with leaders from other neighborhoods.

The new Neighborhoods Commission will advocate for all San Jose neighborhoods. The mission of this organization will be to integrate the voice of neighborhoods into the City of San Jose's decision-making processes. The City will look at this body as a resource when reviewing matters with an impact on neighborhoods, and the Neighborhoods Commission will be consulted on matters of significant community interest that may come before the Council.

Neighborhood Groups that have registered with the Neighborhood Development Center will select proposed commissioners in a caucus to be held for each District. For each District caucus each neighborhood group will send one representative to vote on the commissioners. The public is invited to attend. The caucus schedule includes:

District 2: Monday June 2, 6-9pm, Southside Community Center, Rms 8 & 9, 5585 Cottle Road.

District 10: Sunday June 8, 10am-1pm
